Values for standard bars of precious metals are hereby established:

Platinum—Two million Crowns
Silver—One million Crowns
Octanium—One million Crowns
Gold—Fifty thousand Crowns
Gold Plated Platinum—Ten thousand Crowns.

Standard bars of these metals may be used as legal tender if the bars bear appropriate identification and seals. It is the responsibility of the Department of the Treasury to devise, guard, and authenticate such identification and seals.

The Crown is equal in value to twenty-seven and one-half grains (27.5 gr.) of pure gold (Au). Therefore, a standard bar of pure gold weighs one million, three hundred seventy-five thousand grains (1,375,000 gr.) or one hundred ninety-six pounds, six ounces, and three hundred seventy-five grains (196 lbs., 6 oz., 375 gr.) avoirdupois weight.

The International System (SI) is the official system of measurement of the Empire of Diking. However, the United States Customary System shall also be legal for economics, trade, and transportation.
